Tveit has also met officers, diplomats, politicians and human rights activists in his extensive research. Over the years as a journalist in the Middle East, he has amassed an extensive specialist library. More than ever before, in this book we meet a personal and committed narrator, who is relentless in his review of Western lapses in this long-running conflict.

As a journalist and author, Odd Karsten Tveit has covered the Middle East since 1979. He has been a correspondent for NRK for two periods and has written a long series of award-winning books about the region. With his extensive knowledge and rich sources, he is an international expert on the modern history of the Middle East and the political significance and ramifications of the conflict.
